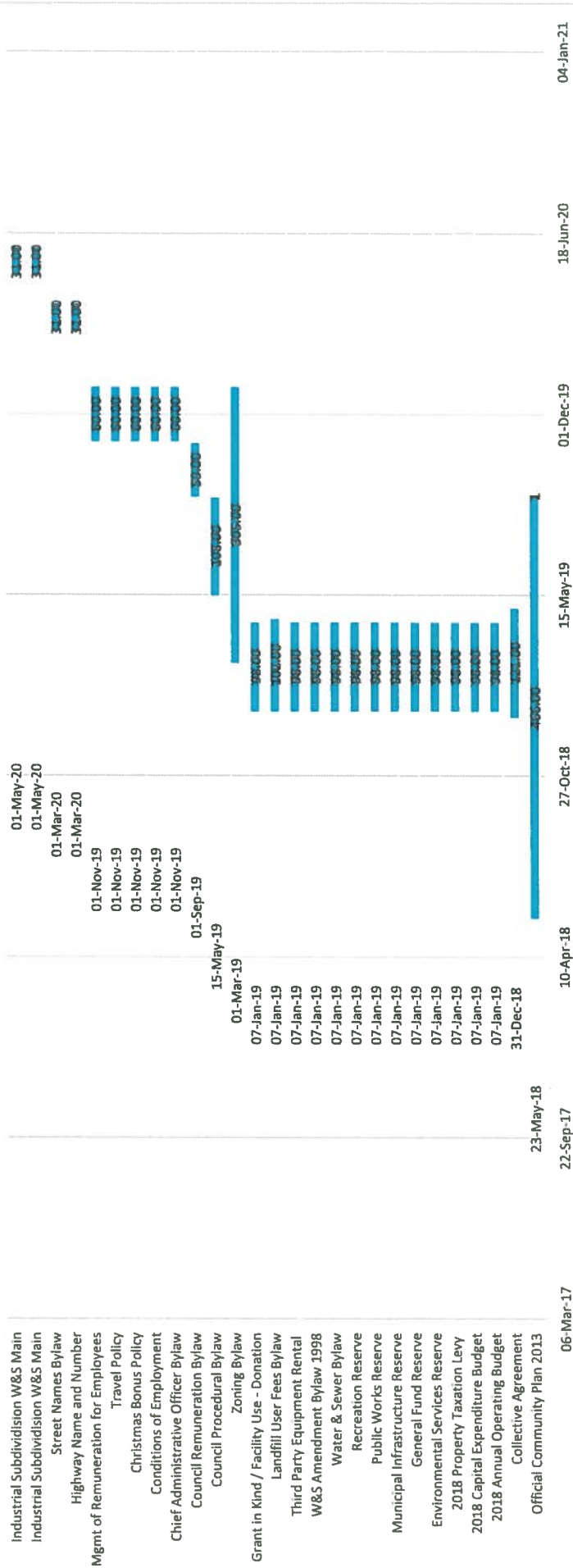

Dear Mayor and Council,

The 2019 Kluane Mountain Bluegrass Festival is scheduled for June 7-9, at the St Elias Convention Centre. As discussed at the 21 November council meeting, we are communicating early regarding an exemption to Bylaw No. 297-13 – “Overnight camping on municipal property”

As per Bylaw No. 297-13 the rationale for having camping adjacent to the St. Elias Convention Centre it to provide close festival access for a few key categories of festival patrons.

- Key festival production personnel
- Disability spaces – first come, first served – for those with a valid disability permit
- Super Pass holders
- Performer spaces
- Additional spaces as capacity allows

As discussed, it would be very helpful to receive a copy of a Surveyor’s Certificate or other similar document related to the area in question so that we can accurately assess the perimeter and available spaces within the perimeter. If we could receive such a document as your earliest convenience that would be most helpful.

Also, as discussed at the council meeting, we are working early to engage with the local business community to promote their businesses, particularly the commercial campground owners. We are also looking at opportunities to present additional festival events at other small venues and businesses in town.

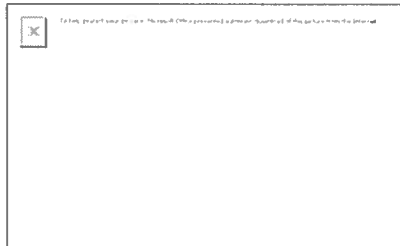

Yukon's Carbon Pricing Rebate for Municipalities

Federal Backstop Program

- Canada will collect the carbon levy and remit it to YTG for rebate.
- The federal levy will consist of a tax on carbon fuels: gasoline, diesel, propane, coal, etc.
- Large users of fuels, 50 K tonnes or more, will pay under an Output Based Pricing System (OBPS) while small users will pay the tax per liter.
 - Those businesses emitting 10-49.9 K tonnes may opt into the OBPS if they wish.
- Agriculture and fishing use will be exempt as well as aviation fuel.



Federal Backstop Program (2)

- Starts January 1st, 2019 at \$20 / tonne
- Increases by \$10 / tonne each year until it reaches \$50 / tonne in 2022.
- Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) will start remitting monies to Yukon government at least six months after CRA collects it.



Yukon Rebate

- Yukoners, Yukon businesses, Municipal governments and First Nations will receive a rebate.
- Each group may have a different rebate program and payout system.
- Looking for the most cost effective administrative processes.



Rebate Principles: 100% Rebated

- Simple and Transparent
- Timely and Responsive
- Minimize administration costs
- Pan-Canadian principle applies:
Discourages consumption of carbon fuels
- Reflects the uniqueness of Yukon



Allocating the Rebate Amounts

- Each of the four groups could receive a % of the total carbon revenues (different % for each group).
- This would allow Yukon to easily quantify the rebate amount for each group and determine the entitlement within each group.
- The total for all four groups is 100%.
- YTG, Canada, NGOs and tourists will not receive a rebate.



Administrative Options

- YTG will administer rebate for Municipalities
- What variables should be used for formulating the distribution across Municipalities?
 - Population?
 - Any particular CMG variables?
 - Other possible variables?
